AGREEING:

- Absolutely
- Exactly
- Definitely
- I see what you mean
- I see your point
- You have a point there.

DISAGREEING:

- I see your point, but ...
- Your point is well taken, but ...
- I beg to differ
- (I'm afraid) That's not always the case

LOOKING FOR AGREEMENT:

- Don't you think?
- Question tags (Isn't it, has it...)
- You know what I mean,

FILLERS:

- So,
- You see, ...
- ..., you see, ...
- You know,
- I mean,
- ..., like, ... (too informal)

SHOW INTEREST IN THE TOPIC:

- Really?
- That's interesting!
- Right!
- I see
- I can't believe it!
- Reply questions: I went to Paris - Did you?
- Uh huh
- As you said before, ... (referring to what the other speaker said before shows you've been paying attention)

GIVING THE FLOOR (turn to speak):

- Don't you think?
- Question tags (Isn't it, has it...)

SAYING "NO" :

- Not really, no (rather than a plain "no")
- ex. -Do you like football? - Not really, no (instead of "noooo!")
- I don't think so.
- ex. Are you coming? - I don't think so.

DIRECT THE CONVERSATION TOWARDS THE TOPIC:

- By the way,
- Speaking of...
- That reminds me of...

KEEPING YOUR LISTENER ENGAGED:

- Rhetorical questions (questions you don't really expect an answer for, you sort of answer them yourself):
What do I mean by that? / Is smoking dangerous? Of course it is
- As you very well know, ...

SUMMARISING:

- In a nutshell,
- To make a long story short,

REPHRASING:

- In other words,
- ..., that is to say, ...
