GREENLAND SHARK: THE OLDEST VERTEBRATE ON EARTH

The news item describes some research carried out on the longevity of the Greenland Shark. The habitat of the Greenland shark are the waters of the (0) _____. The Greenland shark differs physically from the great white shark but they both have the same (1) _____ and big teeth.

A team of researchers experimented on 28 female Greenland sharks that had been caught accidentally. They based their work on the following theory: If the annual growth for this shark had been suggested to be less than a centimeter and this animal can get to be more than (2) _____ long, this would mean that Greenland sharks had to live very long.

In order to calculate their approximate age, the researchers used (3) _____ techniques on the lenses of the sharks' eyes. The results showed that the oldest shark in the experiment could be (4) _____ years old. The percent certainty for the age estimate is (5) _____, i.e. between 272 and 512 years old. The longevity record in a vertebrate animal was previously held by the bowhead (6) _____, which has been estimated to have a maximum lifespan of at least 211 years.

Before this research, reports of very old fish and turtles had not been backed by scientific testing. Among invertebrates, another animal which has been proven to have an extreme longevity is a type of (7) _____, whose growth lines indicate that it can reach 500 years of age.
