

## HAVE

### As a main verb:

### As an auxiliary verb:

- use of auxiliaries (do, be..) as ordinary verbs
- never contracted

- use of contractions, positive and negative.
- V/Subj inversion for questions

1. POSSESSIONS: objects, family relationships, illnesses...

- I have two sisters.
- I had a terrible headache yesterday.
- I don't have much money.
- She has a new teacher.

1. POSSESSIONS: HAVE GOT

- I've got two sisters.
- I haven't got much money.
- She's got a terrible headache

2. HAVE + OBJECT

- I have breakfast early in the morning.
- I'm not having lunch right now.

2. FIXED EXPRESSIONS WITHOUT GOT. (negative sentences)

- I haven't (got) time to go.

3. OBLIGATION

- I have to get up early.
- She has to revise for her test.
- I don't have to wear a tie at work. (lack of obligation)

3. OBLIGATION : HAVE GOT TO (INFORMAL)

- I've got to hurry up. (specific obligation)

4. HAVE SOMETHING DONE

- I always **have my hair cut** once a month.

4. PERFECT TENSES

- I have visited lots of countries.
- We've been studying all afternoon.
- They will have finished the class by the time we get there.
