#### **GENERIC PRONOUN**

## When we refer to people in general:

- You can use the phone in this area.
- One can feel desperate in this kind of situation. (more formal, rarely in spoken English)
- **We** should get to a global agreement before it is too late to change the future. ( to make a general statement including Reader and Listener)
- No matter who enters the group, **they** should follow the instructions as the rest of members. (we can't make reference to a third person singular without knowing their gender, so we use: **they, their, them**..)

#### REFLEXIVE AND RECIPROCAL PRONOUNS

REFLEXIVE PRONOUNS: myself, yourself, himself, herself, itself, ourselves, yourselves, themselves

- when the subject and object of a verb are the same person:

She always looks at **herself** every time she passes by a shop window.

Be careful not to use the reflexive pronoun in verbs which are reflexive in other languages:

He got up himself (él se levantó....)

- ENJOY is always followed by a reflexive pronoun if there is no other object:

Have a nice day and enjoy yourself!

- after a preposition when the complement is the same as the subject:

I managed to finish the race so I felt so proud of myself.

Be careful with prepositions of place, after them do not use reflexive pronouns:

He came in and sat next to **me**. ( not " next to <del>myself</del>")

- to emphasize the subject:

Did you put up all the pieces of furniture yourselves?

- after by, with the meaning of alone, on his/her.. own

I did it by myself (on my own / alone)

RECIPROCAL PRONOUNS: each other, one another (reciprocal actions: A does sth to B, B does the same to A)

We looked at **each other** and laughed.

# IT and THERE

IT

- It + (be) ...: time, temperature and distance

It was 8 o'clock when we got there. / It's freezing, it's only 2 degrees. / It's ten miles from here.

- it + (be) + adjective (preparatory subject)

It was difficult to get to the summit under such conditions.

### **THERE**

- There + (be) ... : meaning things, people exist or not.

There is a cat outside. / There was a big accident on the road last night. / There have been great inventions so far. / There will be trips to the moon in the future.
