## ADJECTIVES FOR SPECULATION

- To say that something is <u>certain</u> to be true or to happen:

Be bound to / be sure to + infinitive

Peter **is bound to** / **sure to** lose his job, he's been really disloyal to his boss. Seguro que Peter pierde su trabajo porque ha sido desleal a su jefe.

- To say that something is <u>probable</u> or <u>not</u> to be true or to happen:

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be likely / unlikely + to + infinitive
be likely / unlikely + that + clause
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Mary is **likely to get** the scholarship. Es probable que Maria consiga una beca. **It's unlikely that** we will travel abroad in short time. Es improbable que podamos viajar fuera pronto/ en poco tiempo.

## ADVERBS FOR SPECULATION

Definitely (indudablemente, definitivamente, clarisimamente) (certainty) / probably (probablemente) (probability) are adverbs so their position can change.

- they go before the main verb:
   They definitely / probably bought the house.
- they go between the auxiliary verb and the main verb: They will definitely / probably buy the house
- they go before the negative auxiliary verb: He definitely / probably won't get the degree.

## With the verb to be:

- **after the verb to be in positive sentences:** Mary is definitely / probably John's wife.

- before the verb to be in negative sentences:

The end of the quarantine definitely / probably <u>isn't</u> next month.
