#### THREE WAYS TO PRONOUNCE "ED"

When "-ed" is part of the past tense of a regular verb, it can be pronounced as /id/, /t/ or /d/ depending on the final sound of the root of the verb.

### Rules for the pronunciation of regular verbs in the past.

a. When the regular verb ends in a **vowel** sound or **voiced** consonant sound the -ed ending is pronounced **/d/.** 

Love /lnv/+ ed = loved /lnvd/

#### **Voiced consonant sounds**

b. When the regular verb ends in an **unvoiced** consonant sound the -ed ending is pronounced **/t/.** 

Finish /finis/ + ed = finished /finist/

# Unvoiced consonant sounds /p/ "p" stop /θ/ th /s/ "s,ss,ce,x" dance, mix, pass /k/ "k,c" park /f/ "f,ph,gh" laugh /ʃ/ "sh" finish /ʧ/ "ch,tch" watch

c. The -ed ending is pronounced **/rd/** when the verb ends in the consonant sounds /t/ and /d/.
